### Spotlight on Betty Gakii

#### Betty Gakii found that "Education is the Key"!

We are pleased to introduce you to Betty Gakii, one of Hope Children's Home's success stories.

Betty grew up in Meru, not far from our orphanage. Her father died when she was 13, and her sickly mother was unable to pay her school fees even though Betty scored well on the qualifying test for secondary school. The Home's Director, Joseph Kirima, understood her need and took her in. Shortly thereafter, Betty was assigned to a dedicated mentor, David Edelstein, an American teaching overseas who agreed to donate \$365 every year until Betty completed her education. With his encouragement, she graduated from secondary school and was accepted into the Teacher Training Program at nearby Chuka University. After graduation from that institution, Betty began teaching Swahili at Naari Secondary School in Meru District. She also fell in love with Sammy Kathurima, a local driver who lives with his

extended family near the Children's Home. They married in 2015.

Betty's teaching career, however, was cut short when the Teachers' Service Commission suddenly increased the requirements for certification as a classroom teacher. Betty found herself needing a new job. Meanwhile, the staff of our Children's Home was seeking a person with the appropriate skills to serve as Joseph's assistant. Betty fit the bill. Shortly after she joined our staff, she gave birth to twin girls – Adrian and Abigail. Because of the proximity between her new home and her workplace, she is able to perform her duties while Sammy's extended family provides childcare for the twins.

Betty's position at the Home includes keeping the accounts and handling communications with the Hope Children's Fund Board. The most difficult part of her job involves aiding our social worker and house mothers in seeing that all 89 young people in our care follow the rules of the Home. The most satisfying part of her job is being able to serve as a role model who exemplifies our motto, "Education is the Key!"

#### World Orphan Fund donation brings renovations and improvements to HCF



We are most thankful for the World Orphan Fund's \$10,000 donation. The WFO assists orphanages around the world, providing assistance to build infrastructure and provide technical training. Steve Donovan of WOF visited the home last fall. Funding from WOF will be implemented in four phases.

- 1. Renovation of kitchen equipment/kitchen
- 2. a. Supplementing beds/mattresses in the youth dormitory
  - b. Construction of a concrete pad in front of the orphanage/installation of a basketball court
- 3. Bathroom facility renovation and improvements
- 4. Further development of the Matovich Technical Training Center

The changes will vastly improve the daily quality of life of the children. We hope the partnership between HCF and WOF will be a longstanding one.





Notes from WOF Nonprofit from guidestar.org We have three hard a fast rules as a charity. 1. We visit personally every orphanage we help. You cannot make a solid assessment without spending time with the children or their caretakers. 2. We insist on absolutely no overhead. We pay our own travel costs, and what few expense exist are reimbursed by the founder. That means 100% of cash donations go directly to projects.

3. We mostly focus on emergency and transformational funding funding solutions to problems orphanages cannot afford, or cannot see.

Mentor ads: \$25 for mentors only. Up to 100 words and a single photo (photo offset ready).



#### Save Money on Your Taxes and Help Hope Children's Fund

The new IRS tax code allows individuals over the age of 70½ to make contributions to organizations such as Hope Children's Fund directly from their qualified retirement plans. What this means is that someone can take all, or a portion, of their Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and have their financial institution send the contribution directly to HCF.

The amount you send is considered part of your RMD, but not taxable income. Please ask your tax accountant how to take advantage of this tax loophole as you consider your contribution to Hope Children's Fund.


